

5. The Process for Establishing the POs, PSOs and COs:

The POs, PSOs and COs are established through the Curriculum Design and Development Process. The Vision, Mission and Graduate Attributes of the Department used in defining the POs, PSOs and COs

6.PROCESS INVOLVED IN POS, PSOS AND COS ATTAINMENT:

- Relationship between COs and PO, PSO are mapped and scoring is assigned. If there exists a strong relationship score '3' is given. If there exists a Medium association between the COs and PO, PSO, score '2' is assigned. For a lesser relationship score '1' is provided. If there does not exists any relationship between the outcomes no score is provided.
- The total score for each PO and PSO against the Course Outcomes of each course are calculated.
- The total score for each PO and PSO against all the Course Outcomes of all courses are calculated.
- Contribution of each course in attainment of POs and PSOs are calculated by :-

 $Course\ contribution = \ \frac{\textit{Total\ scoring\ of\ course\ outcomes\ of\ one\ course\ in\ each\ PO\ and\ PSO}}{\textit{Total\ scoring\ of\ course\ outcomes\ of\ all\ courses\ in\ each\ PO\ and\ PSO}}\ X\ 100$

- The Direct attainment is calculated by percentage of students secured greater than 50% marks in Continuous Internal Assessments and End Semester Examinations.
 Sum of 30% weightage is takenfrom Continuous Internal Assessmentsperformance and 70% of weightage is takenfrom End Semester Examinations.
- Indirect attainment is evaluated by considering the Placement, progression to Higher Education and Entrepreneurship.

- Average attainment is calculated by taking 80% weightage of Direct Attainment and 20% weightage of Indirect Attainment
- Weighted contribution of courses outcome in attainment of PO and PSO is assessed by the product of average course attainment and course weightage.

Weighted contribution of course outcome attainment = Ccontribution of each course X Average attainment of each course

• Final attainment is derived by consolidating the weighted contribution of all courses outcome attainment.

7.LEVELS OF OUTCOMES AND RELATIONSHIP:

There are four levels of outcome such as Course Outcome (CO), Program Outcome (PO), Program Specific Outcome (PSO) and Graduate Attributes (GA).

Course Outcomes are the statements that declare what students should be able to achieve at the end of a course. POs are defined by Chairman of the various Boards, which confirms the statements about the knowledge, skills and attitudes, graduate attributes, a formal Arts program should have. The Program outcomes reflect the ability of graduates to demonstrate knowledge in fundamentals of Humanities, to apply the knowledge practically in core subjects, electives and projects, which enables the graduates to be competent at the time of graduation. The graduates must adhere to professional and ethical responsibilities in the pursuit of their careers by shaping them as a Good Samaritan. The course outcomes also enable the graduates to pursue higher studies and engage in Research for a successful career. The proper definition and the attainment of POs contribute to the attributes, which helps the graduate to perform his/ her duties and responsibilities.

Program Specific Outcomes are the statements that specify the learning outcomes of the grandaunts. Graduate Attributes are the broad statements which describe in detail about the career developments even after significant years of graduation and how the program prepare the grandaunts toachieve.




Figure 2: Relating the outcomes (CO-PO&PSO-GA)

Above figure indicates the building block of CO-PO&PSO-GA relationship. After CO statements are developed by the course in-charge, COs will be mapped with any possible POs based on the relationship that exist between them. But the POs are not necessarily mapped with any one COs and it may be left blank. Anyhow, it is mandatory that all POs should be mapped with any one

of PSOs. This is shown in the below figure.




Figure 3: Relationship between CO, PO &PSO

8.PROCESS USED TO IDENTIFY THE CURRICULAR GAPS TO THE ATTAINMENT OF COs, POs and PSOs

The processes used to identify the curricular gaps to the attainment of COs/POs/PSOs are:

Step-1:

The course handling faculty, after CO-PO mapping, submit the mapping results to the HoD.

Step-2:

To bridge the curriculum gap identified in the course, Action Plan is recommended by the Course-incharge to the HoD.

Step-3:

The HoD analyses the devised Action Plan and along with the members of faculty, suggest to arrange for the Workshops, Seminars, Symposiums, Guest Lecture as a part of Co-curricular activities.

11.ASSESSMENTPROCESS OF COS ATTAINMENT:

The attainment of Programme outcomes and Programme Specific Outcomes are assessed with the help of outcomes of the relevant courses. The Institution measures the attainment of the course outcomes with the two different assessment tools.

- Direct Assessment Tools
- Indirect Assessment Tools

Direct Assessment Tools:

The knowledge and skills described in the course outcomes are assessed directly based on the student's performance, through Continuous Internal Assessment and End Semester Examinations (Comprehensive Examination) marks.

- Continuous Internal Assessment: Performance of student is recorded through Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA), Class assignments / Seminars, Attendance and Skill Evaluation.
- End Semester Examination: Performance of student is recorded through End Semester Examinations (Comprehensive examination), End Semester Practical Examinations and Project Evaluation.

Indirect Assessment Tools: Performance of students are recorded through the progress at the end and after the completion of the programmeby using any one of the following three parameters.

- Placement
- Progression to Higher Education and Research
- Entrepreneurship
- The Direct attainment is calculated by percentage of students secured greater than 50% marks in Continuous Internal Assessments and End semester examinations.
 Sum of 30% weightage is taking in Continuous Internal Assessments performance and 70% weightage is taking in End semester Examinations.
- Indirect attainment is evaluated by considering the placement, progression to higher education and entrepreneurship using with the following formula:-

Indirect attainment


 $= \frac{\text{No of students placed, progressing in higher education and Entrepreneurship}}{\text{No of students passed}} X 100$

- Average attainment is calculated by taking sum of 80% weightage of Direct Attainment and 20% weightage of Indirect Attainment
- Final Weighted contribution of courses outcome in attainment of PO and PSO is assessed by the product of average course attainment and course weightage score.

Final Weighted Contribution = *Course Weightage score X Average Course Attainment*

 Final attainment is derived by consolidating the weighted contribution of all courses outcome attainment.


